## Agenda Item No. B-1 Mayo Farm Squash Culvert Permit Application(s)

**Summary**: During the July storm, a wooden pedestrian foot bridge washed out at the Mayo Farm. The foot bridge was used for people to cross from Field A to Field B without navigating alongside Weeks Hill Road. The bridge also served as a crossing for the Quiet Path and special events. There is an existing foot bridge that remains closer to the parking lot however the large volume of users during special events necessitates two points of crossing for safety and emergency purposes.

The Town is still in the process of restoring our infrastructure from the June/July flooding events. Rather than replace the damaged bridge, which would require a more substantive structure due to the larger elevated span required for FEMA and Flood Plane compliance, staff has contracted to install a properly sized arch type of culvert. The arch culvert is proposed to be relocated in a more central location (see enclosed map) to provide improved pedestrian connectivity and separation to the main river channel. The squash culvert allows for an at-grade crossing, without fill in the flood zone. Staff advanced the ordering of the culvert and is seeking quotes for Construction in an attempt to have it installed prior to several major special events that have been permitted to occur this fall season (i.e., soccer tournament, British Invasion, pumpkin chucking festival, etc.).

This portion of Mayo Farm is located within the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) (i.e., the FEMA designated 100-year floodplain). Municipalities participating in the National Flood Insurance Program are required to regulate all development within the mapped SFHA in accordance with minimum FEMA standards. Stowe has elected to regulate development within the SFHA through its adopted Zoning Regulations. Under statute, prior to the issuance of any permit, municipalities must coordinate all proposed development within the SFHA with the State of Vermont Rivers Program, who provides technical assistance. Due to the timing of upcoming special events and anticipated installation time, the Town Manager has submitted the zoning application and is seeking retroactive Selectboard approval to do so.


**Town Plan Impact**: Conforms with the following Flood Resiliency Policy of the Stowe Town Plan: *The Town will continue to administer its Flood Hazard Regulations, to be updated as needed, to maintain eligibility in the National Flood Insurance Program*.

**Fiscal Impact**: The cost of the squash culvert is \$5,000 +/- plus installation. Public Works estimates a bridge at this location, if permittable, would be \$250,000 - \$500,000. It would need be a steel beam bridge with wood decking and concrete foundations elevated above the flood level.


**Recommendation**: Move to authorize the Town Manager to apply for all permits required for an arch culvert crossing replacement of the bridge between Mayo Farm Fields A&B.
